**Latex free medical thrombosis prophylaxis stockings with antibacterial toe, lipomed, stockings with or without toe, Circaid glove and toe cap made of polyamide/elastane in white and coloured, pigment printed, including accessories (sewing thread, printed label, crochet and woven tape, elastic tape, silicone nubs); partly finished with biological active products accepted by OEKO-TEX®; produced by using materials certified according to STANDARD 100 by OEKO-TEX®.**

The results of the inspection made according to STANDARD 100 by OEKO-TEX®, Annex 4, **product class II** have shown that the above mentioned goods meet the human-ecological requirements of the STANDARD 100 by OEKO-TEX® presently established in Annex 4 for products with direct contact to skin.
