Control report

The Building and Environment Committee carried out a food inspection of Rationtech with company registration number: 559237-3640 and address Hyvelgatan 16, 741 71 Knivsta. This was a regular inspection, which the authority carries out regularly.

The check took the form of a pre-announced inspection on 5 October 2023.

The fee for processing the case is SEK 5439 and corresponds to 3.5 hours of inspection time. An invoice is sent out separately. The fee is levied in accordance with the taxa established by the City Council.

Processing means the total time spent by each official of the Board on preparation, contacts with parties, consultations with experts and authorities, inspections, audits, sampling and other checks, and post-processing.



No discrepancies were found during the inspection and what was checked was:

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During the audit, the following legal requirements were checked with no discrepancies

Food information: The labelling was reviewed on four of the company's products and assessed as acceptable. In some cases, an additional designation in Swedish may need to be added if the company chooses to supply a broader customer base in the future.

Traceability: Adequate traceability systems were demonstrated one step backwards and one step forwards. **Food contact materials:** Unremarkable, see attached annexes in the dossier. A question was asked afterwards regarding the text "this material may be used in all food contact applications except holding food during cooking" which was related to the packaging of food delivered from South Africa. These packages were said to contain only cold food - such as dry goods and cold breakfast. However, the company would investigate the meaning of the text and feed back what is meant to the environmental unit.

Hazard analysis and critical control points: discussion mainly on how the company acts to be able to recall food and trace deliveries if necessary.

The Building and Environment Council checks that businesses comply with food law. The content of the inspection report only reflects the results of what has been inspected. See also Knivsta municipality's website: [Food control](#). As of 1 July 2020, the environmental unit has switched to retrospective billing for the annual inspection. This means that in the future, an invoice will be sent after each inspection visit, instead of paying in advance at the beginning of each year for the upcoming inspection.

Follow-up of non-conformities

The Building and Environment Council sometimes carries out follow-up checks on non-compliance to ensure compliance with food law.

The objectives of the legislation can be fulfilled in different ways. Therefore, there may also be different ways to address non-compliance. During a follow-up inspection, the operator must be able to show that the objectives of the legislation have been met. When the authority carries out

an extra inspection, in addition to the regular one, to follow up the non-compliance, the entrepreneur must pay a fee. If the authority comes to the conclusion that the legislation is not being complied with, the authority can decide on, for example, an injunction or prohibition.

Notify changes or cessation of activities

The obligation to pay a fee for food control ceases from the turn of the year following the year in which the Board is informed in writing that the activity has ceased. If the fee for the activity is changed, the new fee applies immediately after the decision has been made.

Always notify changes or cessation of activities in writing or by email, and make sure you receive confirmation of your notification - for your own protection.
